- Participating cities: 7Delhi, Hanoi, Kuala Lumpur, Manila, Seoul, Taipei, Tokyo
- Managing city: Tokyo
- © Since 2009, production and performance of performing art works and workshops for joint production are implemented mainly in Tokyo through the exchange of artists from participating cities.

- Writing reports, etc.


Works are performed at the Tokyo Metropolitan Theatre from November 28 to 30, 2014.
